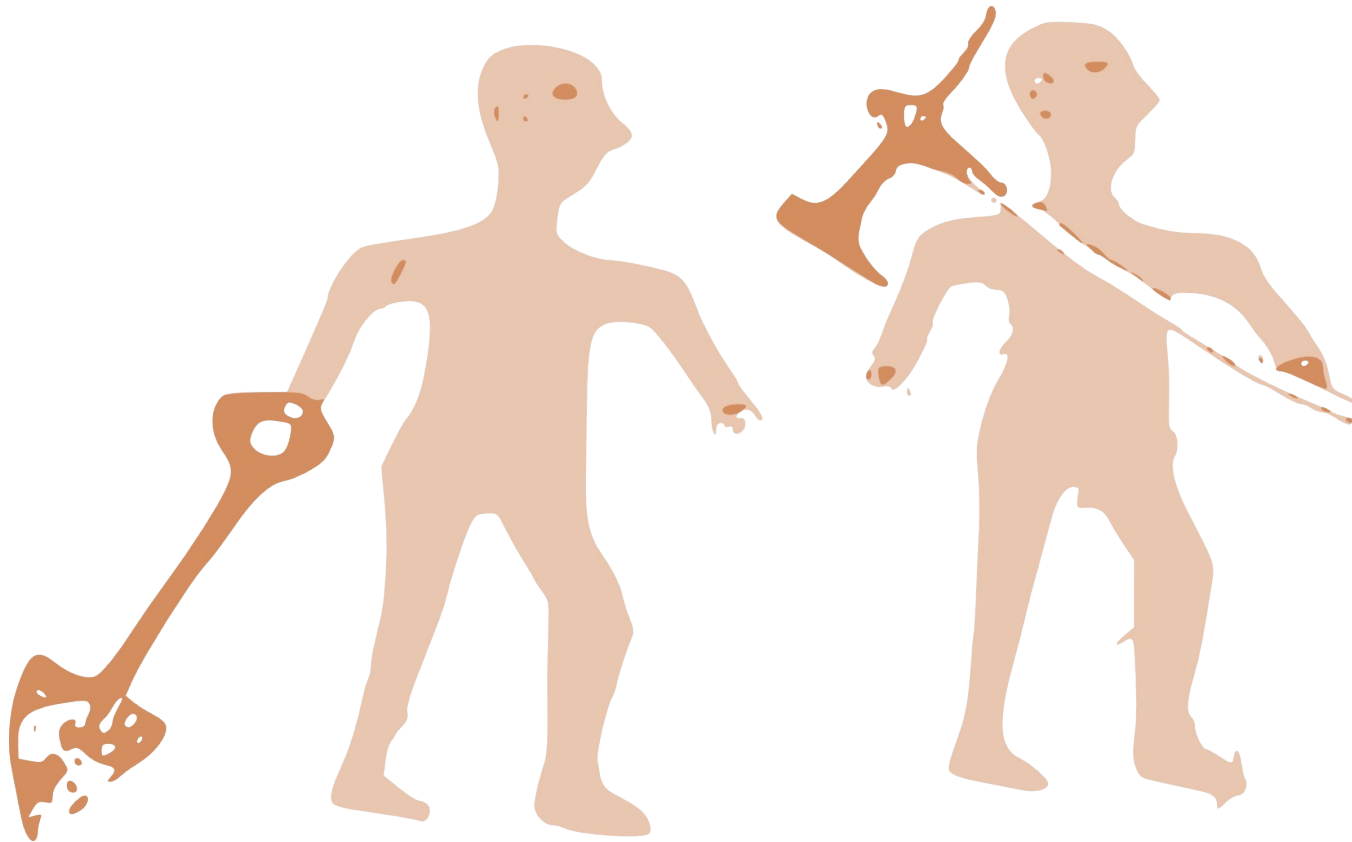

Martin A. Klein taught at the University of Toronto for 29 years before his retirement. He has also taught at Berkeley, Wellesley College, Carleton College, Stanford, Lovanium in Kinshasa, and the University of Rhode Island. He has written or edited ten books, including *Slavery and Colonial Rule in French West* (Cambridge, 1998), *Islam and Imperialism in Senegal: Sine-Saloum 1847-1914* (1968), *Women and Slavery in Africa* (co-edited with Claire C. Robertson), *Slavery and Colonial Rule in Africa* (co-edited with Suzanne Miers), and most recently *African Voices on Slavery and the Slave Trade* (co-edited with Alice Bellagamba and Sandra E. Greene). Most of his research has been on the history of slavery and the slave trade in Africa. The American Historical Association has named the Prize in African History in his honor to recognize the most distinguished work of scholarship on African history published in English
