Complete the second sentence so that it has a similar meaning to the first sentence, using the word given. Do not change the word given. You must use between two and five words, including the word given.

- 2 Can you give me directions for the station? HOW
Could you tell ME HOW TO GET TO the station?
- 3 You must be thirsty, so can I offer you some tea? LIKE
You must be thirsty so, WOULD YOU LIKE SOME tea?
- 4 If I were you, I wouldn't buy a dog. SHOULD
I don't THINK YOU SHOULD BUY A dog.
- 5 I'm sure that Jack hasn't left home yet. HAVE
Jack WON'T HAVE LEFT home yet.
- 6 I suppose that this is Trafalgar Square. BE
This COULD BE / MIGHT BE / MUST BE Trafalgar Square.
- 7 Perhaps Jane's plane was delayed. BEEN
Jane's plane MAY / MIGHT / COULD HAVE BEEN delayed.
- 8 It was unnecessary for you to come early today. HAVE
You NEEDN'T HAVE come early today.
